What is a TVI?

- A teacher of children or students who have blindness or low vision
- Trained in the Expanded Core Curriculum (ECC), a curriculum specific to children with visual impairments
- Instruction is done by a certified
 Teacher of the Visually Impaired (TVI)

Why is a TVI important for an infant or toddler?

- Introducing a TVI as early as possible supports a child's overall developmental progress and independence
- Up to 90% of what typical children learn is through vision -- TVIs are trained specifically in the impact vision loss or the absence of vision has on a child's development
- Brings information to the child that they are not able to incidentally gain through vision

What does a TVI do with infants and toddlers?

- Helps the family to provide the child with a variety of experiences and tools to access their environment and to use existing functional vision
- Provides tactually interesting and engaging activities and strategies
- Supports the child in developing other senses (hearing, listening, tactile) to explore and discriminate within their environment
- Uses evidence-based practices to encourage developmental progress, independence, social interaction, and exploration
- Incorporates elements of the Expanded Core Curriculum (ECC) into instruction
- Works closely with your developmental therapist, Certified Orientation & Mobility Specialist (COMS) and other team members for a collaborative approach
- Conducts vision-specific assessments to inform goals



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
