



Teacher of the Visually Impaired (TVI) versus

Vision Therapist







An educator who works with children who have blindness, low vision or visual disabilities and their families

Provides education and training for caregivers and access to the school curriculum for the student

Addresses developmental or educational goals in an Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) or Individualized Education

Plan (IEP)

Service provided in the home or school (or other natural environments)

Serves children and/or their families from birth to 22

Funded by IDEA Part B or C with no cost to families



A medical professional (sometimes an optometrist) who works with anyone who has vision problems

Provides supervised eye exercises for the patient

Addresses visual processing issues and/or helps to build visual skills

Service provided in doctor's office (or sometimes at home)

Serves all ages (most require 3 years or older)

Funded by private insurance, Medicaid or out-of-pocket payments
