#### From our Executive Director

Dear BEST Friends,

We are honored to share the incredible impact you—our donors, partners, collaborators, and supporters—have made possible over the past fiscal year. In our mission to serve Tennessee's youngest children with vision loss, we remain steadfast and laser-focused. This year, Blind Early Services TN (BEST) walked alongside more than 350 families across the state—our largest reach since our founding just five years ago.

Through our partnership with the Tennessee Early Intervention System (TEIS), we provided inhome and community-based services tailored to each child and family's unique needs. Our growing team of Teachers of the Visually Impaired, Orientation & Mobility Specialists, and Occupational and Developmental Therapists ensures that children receive the specialized support they need in those crucial first years. In addition, we trained service providers statewide through our annual VIISA certification program and celebrated four of our team members pursuing advanced degrees to deepen their expertise.

This year also brought special recognition: BEST was honored with the 2025 TN AER Commitment to Opportunity Award and recognized by Leadership Music in this 3rd year of its Giving Generously program —both, a testament to our dedication to creating pathways for children with vision loss to thrive.

Financially, we have strengthened our foundation for long-term sustainability, securing vital partnerships and grants that allow us to meet increasing demand while staying true to our family-centered approach. This year's growth reflects not only the need for vision-specific early intervention in Tennessee, but also the trust you have placed in BEST to deliver it.

From our humble beginnings as the vision of two mothers to becoming a trusted statewide resource, our journey has always been fueled by the generosity of this community. You have given your time, talent, and resources to ensure that children with blindness or low vision have the tools, confidence, and joy to explore their world from the very start.

BEST begins to create our satellite team of vision informed early interventionists in Memphis (Shelby County, TN).


## Summer 2024



## BEST Together: Inaugural Camp BEST

In July, BEST welcomed families to our very first summer camp, held at First Presbyterian Church in Nashville. Fifteen children participated in a week of joyful learning and exploration designed to nurture literacy, social skills, orientation and mobility, and sensory engagement.

The camp theme, inspired by the children's classic We're Going on a Bear Hunt, set the stage for a variety of creative activities. Children experienced storybox read-alouds, interactive sound effect storytime, sensory bins and texture mats, and even music therapy sessions led by visiting providers from Empower Music Therapy LLC.





Thanks to the generosity of the Foreseeable Future Foundation and the Preds Foundation, Camp BEST was offered at no cost to families, ensuring accessibility for all. This inaugural week brought families together in a supportive community, blending fun with meaningful developmental growth.
